United States, Steve McQueen

12 Years a Slave is based on the autobiography of Solomon Northup, a free black man who was abducted from New York and sold into slavery in the mid-1800s.

French, Rachid Bouchareb

The long-forgotten story of North African soldiers who joined the French army to help liberate France from Nazi occupation during World War II.

Metro Manila (2012)

Great Britain, Sean Ellis
